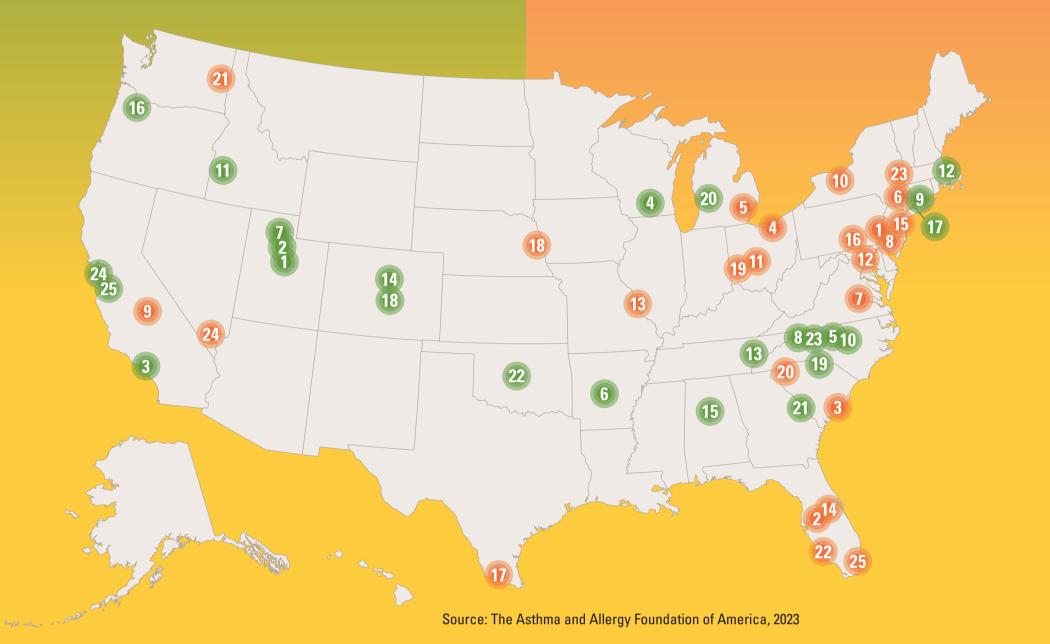

## Stay on top of your asthma

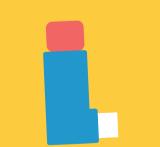
Pollen, air quality, pets and smoking can all affect asthma and other respiratory conditions. Know what triggers your breathing issues, and use these tips to keep them under control.
